#### **Upsilon Pi Epsilon**

Upsilon Pi Epsilon is an honor society founded at Texas A&M University in 1967. Its mission is to recognize academic excellence at both the undergraduate and graduate levels in the Computing and Information Disciplines. It is the first, and only, existing national honor society serving these disciplines, with more than 275 chapters in the United States and abroad. UPE provides scholarships and awards to student members of UPE, the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM), and IEEE Computer Society. As a founding sponsor of the International Collegiate Programming Contest (ICPC), UPE provides awards and prizes for ICPC contestants. UPE also provides an annual award to the Consortium for Computing Sciences in Colleges (CCSC).
